

Vision Alfalfa

What is it?

A variety of alfalfa that excels in regrowth, persistence, yield, disease resistance and forage quality.

Why grow it?

Features		Benefits
High yielding	➔	108% forage yield advantage and 112% milk yield advantage
High multifoliate expression	➔	Outstanding feed quality, lower fibre and better fibre digestibility for better milk production
Extreme winterhardiness and Excellent Fall dormancy	➔	Suited to the harsh conditions of Western Canada Winterhardiness = 1.5 and Fall dormancy of 4.4
Excellent regrowth	➔	Adapts well to multi-cut hay /silage systems
Excellence disease resistance	➔	Increased stand longevity with a disease resistance index of 30

How to grow it...

Seeding Information	Adaptations	Management
10-12 lbs /ac of inoculated seed	Well drained soils preferred	Recommended not to graze below 10-15 cm
Seed ¼ to ½ inch deep	Tolerance to saline and alkaline soils	If cut for hay, cut at 10% bloom or earlier for optimum forage quality
Seed bed should be firm; packing may be required	Excellent winterhardiness	Fertilize according to soil tests; phosphate, potash and sulphur required
